The children have started the summer term with great enthusiasm and positivity towards learning, and engaging in a variety of activities inside and outside of the classroom. All classes have demonstrated a good understanding of our school value of responsibility over the last few weeks by revisiting and revising classroom charters, and taking on additional responsibility across the school. 

**YEAR 1:** It has been lovely welcoming the children back after Easter for our final term together. As the weather is becoming warmer, the children will be venturing outside this half term to further their scientific knowledge and understanding of plants and trees linked to our topic '*Global Garden*.' We will

be learning about healthy eating and being our best self in our PSHE unit as well as creating our own natural prints in the style of William Morris in art. We have started this past week thinking about our responsibility for caring for our planet and the children have created some fantastic poems linked to our text '10 things I can do to help my world.'



# **Year Group News**

**YEAR 2:** What a busy two weeks it has been back after Easter. Year 2 have settled back into routines and continued learning with enthusiasm. In English, the children have already visited Forest School to collect vocabulary for poetry writing before moving on to writing a persuasive letter to help transform an old disused car park into a beautiful garden. In maths, the children predicted and estimated the temperature around the school and have now begun identifying and finding fractions. In science the children are observing plant growth over April and May. In art, the children have enjoyed exploring the semi-abstract work of artist Henry Moore. The children are very excited to see his work in person at the Tate Britain at the end of May.

**YEAR 3:** The Year 3 team are excited to welcome back the children after the Easter break. The children have returned rested and are raring to learn. So far, the children have started a new book in English called *The King Who Banned the Dark* and been very serious whilst taking on the role of King. The children will be creating placards to prevent the King's plan of taking

away the dark for good as well writing diary entries and a persuasive piece! The summer term will hopefully bring more sunshine which is great news for Year 3 as our new science topic is light. The children have enjoyed taking their learning outside to look at different light sources and will soon be learning about how light travels and shadows! As part of our science topic, the children

have the Freshwater Theatre Company visiting to help consolidate what the children have learnt in a theatrical manner. The children have a lot to


look forward to this term including the King's Coronation, Mental Health Awareness Week and of course the year 3 sleepover taking place on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May.

**Year 5:** Year 5 have started a new English text: *The Last Wild* and have really enjoyed writing persuasive adverts as well as exciting newspaper articles. We have started practising our musical pieces for the summer concert using the steel pans. We have spent lots of time preparing for our upcoming residential trip which we are very excited about.

**YEAR 6:** We have had a great start to our final term at Burhill in Year 6! Lots of learning has already taken place as the children look towards their End of Key Stage Assessments. The Year 6 team are so proud of all the children for working so hard already.

This half term in Year 6 we have lots of fun and exciting activities planned. We are kicking off with an Ancient Greek dress up day to learn lots about this period in history, followed shortly after by our assessment week. After this we will be packing in lots of learning about our transition to secondary school. We will be investigating the human body in science and have already learnt about the heart and blood in our bodies. In English, we have started to read our new text *Pig Heart Boy*, looking at a moral dilemma based on a theme in the book. We are currently writing balanced arguments based on this theme and are looking forward to finding out what happens next in the book already! In art, we are looking at Claude Monet and creating our own pieces based on his artwork and in PE we are looking forward to learning some new cricket skills in the sunny weather.

The children took part in assemblies to learn about what an allergy is, develop an understanding of some symptoms of an allergic reaction as well as what we are continuing to do as a school to protect those around us who have allergies.



#### SCHOOL LUNCHES



# SCHOOL ABSENCES – **PENALTY NOTICES**

A reminder to parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
